**Deborah Simpkin King, PhD**, is a visionary choral conductor, new music advocate and master teacher. She plays an active role in the vibrant Manhattan choral scene, and serves the national and international music community through her guest conducting and body of published work.

Her leadership as a conductor is ongoing with not only her own four choral ensembles, but also within Lincoln Center’s Mostly Mozart Festival and other guest conducting appearances. Through PROJECT : ENCORE (which she

founded), Dr. King is at the leading edge of the new music industry, working with composers in finding post-premiere performances, and performing many premieres herself.

As an ongoing columnist with ACDA’s *The Choral Journal*, and host of public radio’s *Sounds Choral*, she serves the music community worldwide. Supplementing her work in the not-for-profit and professional conducting arena, Dr. King frequently works as a professor and as a director of music within church programs.
